








Angel Smrikarov, coordinator of HiEdTec opened the meeting.




Academician Hristo Boleov, Rector of the University of Ruse congratulated the participants.







All partner universities presented themselves.





Anastasiya Aliyasova showed a dissemination movie which presents the HiEdTec project in Kazakhstan.








Angel Smrikarov presented a Concept of Distance Learning Design

Stoyanka Smrikarova, financial manager of the HiEdTec presented financial matters.



Her presentation began with two good pieces of news about the project from the EACEA - extending the project duration by one year due to the pandemic and increasing the total Staff costs budget by 20%, which obliges the entire consortium to complete all planned tasks on time and with higher quality.

The most common mistakes in filling in the Timesheets and Declarations were mentioned, such as reporting the work done in another period,




signing these documents not by the rector or the person authorized for this purpose, lack of some of the certificates certifying that the employees under the project, have an employment contract with the university.

It was reminded again that the exchange rate of the relevant currency to EUR to be used in the project is the exchange rate at the date of receipt of the second tranche. The presentation ended with the deadlines for the upcoming tasks.

Robert Janz, external evaluator of the HiEdTec presented his view about the project.



Robert Janz offered to assist in the creation of the Sustainable academic network. He mentioned that project tasks are being completed on time, but the involvement of the ministries and project sustainability after the end of the project were very important should be addressed.

Tzvetomir Vassilev mentioned about the role of the ministries in distributing the Concepts to all universities in the corresponding countries and that cooperation with similar networks is planned in all CA countries.






He said that disseminating the results of the project throughout Central Asia will be one of the main tasks until the end of the project.
