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## 1 HiEdTec 9<sup>TH</sup> PROJECT MEETING FEEDBACK

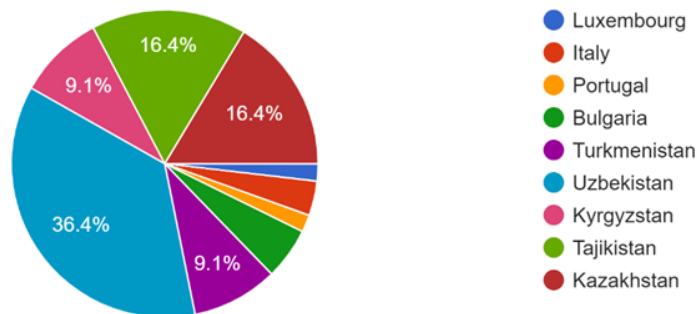

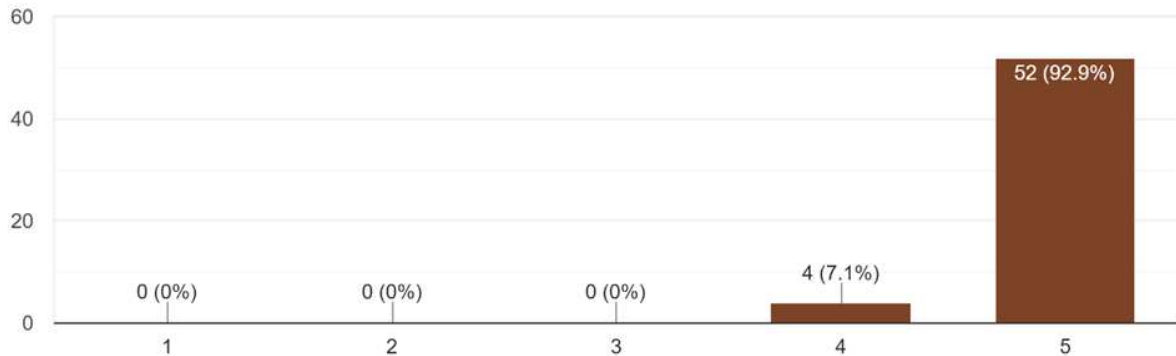

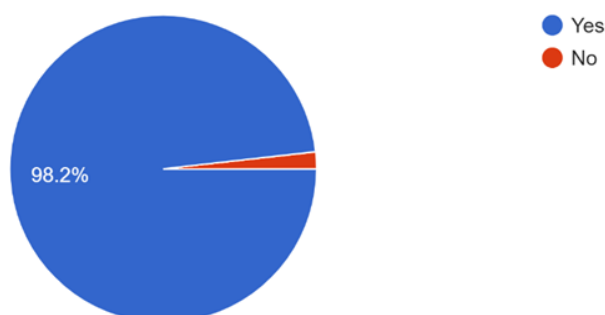
